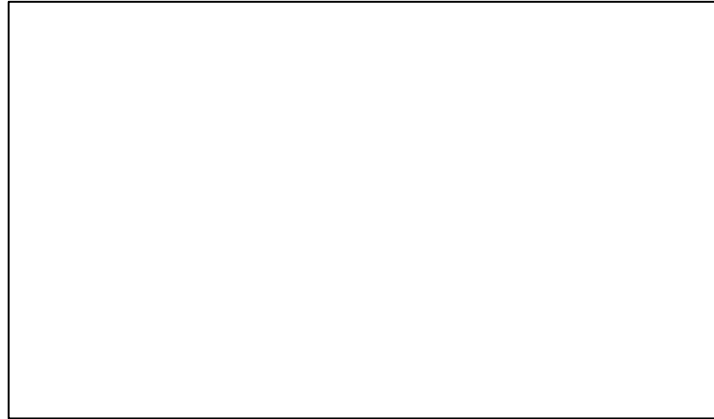


Figure 1 This is example of a figure
